New Building 6th Form Block & Maintenance Buildings

Whitfield & Brown were delighted to be appointed to undertake the construction of a new 6th Form Block & Maintenance Buildings for The Grange Independent School.

Situated on the site of the former stable block which was demolished, the new sixth form sits in the north eastern corner of the Senior School beyond the Grange Theatre and Performing Arts Building. The two storey pavilion style building is of brick and render construction with artstone surrounds to the polyester coated aluminium windows, the brick used matches the brickwork on the existing buildings on the site. The main roof is a slate hipped roof with a glazed lantern.

The new cutting edge building has a large lobby area with toilet accommodation to the side and a separate entrance at the rear of the building with a terrace and garden. Large windows provide views from the hall into the courtyard with Clerestory glazed top lighting the entrance lobby and staircase.

Whilst being within the school grounds, the 6th form centre now provides a largely self-contained social and study facility. The ground floor comprises of a substantial common room which can accommodate over 200 students at break and meal times. At the centre of the common room is a café and kitchen. There are also study facilities on both floors along with offices, two classrooms, a careers room and bookable seminar rooms.
