Redevelopment & Refurbishment of existing Worship Place

Redevelopment of the existing sanctuary space.

Chorley Methodist Church was conceived in 2011 following the merger of Park Road Methodist Church and Trinity Methodist Church. The church has been redeveloped and re modelled to provide an inviting environment suited to modern worship.

The ground floor has been totally redesigned and adapted with the removal of the fixed pews to create a large space for worship, community activities and fellowship gathering and the high ceilings and tasteful decoration promotes the overwhelming feeling of warmth and openness.

New glazed partitions have been installed to maximise the infiltration of light through and all the stained glass windows have been refurbished and reinstated. On the first floor, the gallery has been refurbished so that the space can be utilised for the congregation during services.

Aside from the internal re-configuration, the roof has been removed and re-slated and the cupola has been dismantled in sections and renewed.
